Kiersten Samalis is a 2020 graduate from Bridgewater State University where she earned her Bachelor's degree in Theater Performance.


Living in Orange, she's had the pleasure of doing theater shows at Mahar as a student.

Dear Families,

As you may have heard, vaccines for children ages 5-11 are available at many locations. The Vax Bus will be in Erving on November 18, 2021. Over fifty students have signed up to visit the Vax Bus. It's amazing how this topic has become a huge discussion point amongst our students—many students seem to



be giddy with excitement about getting their vaccination. As of today, we have 56% of our students and 92% of our staff signed up for in-house Covid testing. Thank you to everyone for your help keeping our school healthy and safe! If you haven't signed up for rapid and pooled testing, click the link HERE for more information. Starting November 29, 2021, our arrival and dismissal protocols will change. After this date, students will enter and be dismissed through the front door. We will call one bus at a time (both to enter and exit the building) to pace the number of students moving through the front door. Parent pick-ups will also start to take place at the front door. We are making this change as the winter weather approaches, so that we can get these new routines in place.

We will also move lunch indoors on November 29, since our tent will be coming down. We are looking at having two groups of students at a time eat in the cafe, and then they will head out to recess right away. Students will all face the windows in the same direction and be spaced at three feet apart. The largest group of students will be 35 students and we will have four lunch periods using this model. When the lunch schedule is finalized we will share it with everyone.

Please remember that tomorrow is Veterans Day and, in observance, there will be no school. Thank you to all of the veterans in our community. Veterans Day has always been a very important day for me and my family. At SRS we have three retired veterans, Tammy Richard (Army), Jennifer Smith (Army), and Lynn Oski (Army and Navy). If you see them, please thank them for their service. When I was a kid, I remember going to visit the VFW with my grandparents to say thank you to all the men and women who had served. At SRS we would normally host a special Community Sing to show appreciation to our local veterans, but this year Mr. Cortina will host virtually. Again, thank you to all those who are serving and who have served our country.
