

Dear Families,

As we prepare to leave for the Holiday Break, we remind everyone of the safety recommendations we made prior to the Thanksgiving Break, and we thank everyone for continuing to consider them best practice for the Holiday Break and for being ever mindful of our shared goal to keep our school community



safe and healthy. My hope is that we will return to school in January without any positive cases, despite rising numbers.

Again, if your family plans include travel or hosting guests, we ask that you please provide negative COVID-19 test results for your students upon their return to school. If you are unable to provide negative COVID-19 test results for your students, we encourage you to consider keeping your students home on Monday, January 3. However, all students are encouraged to return and participate in pooled testing on Tuesday, January 4.

During arrival and dismissal there are students exiting and entering both sides of their vehicles. Unless you have been directed to proceed by a staff member, please do not ever pass a vehicle parked in the driveway. Thank you for your patience as we work to ensure safety for our students.

Dear Swift River Families,

We thank you for your efforts to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 within our school community. With local case numbers rapidly rising, new variant information circulating, and the upcoming holiday break, prevention and safety measures are as important as ever. Still, we are happy that we have kept COVID from spreading in our building, despite having had positive cases within our community. I truly believe that the layered approach of vaccines, ventilation, masks, washing hands, maintaining distance, and staying home when ill is keeping us up and running.

We are very grateful to everyone who has been proactive regarding illness. We ask that you please continue to refer to the sick policy as needed and to ensure that students are being checked at home every day. Medicating students and sending them to school without any communication is unacceptable. When students require medication, please take time to relay this information to the school in order to adequately assess what actions should be taken regarding potential illness. If your student presents with any concerning symptoms while at school, they will need to be picked up immediately and remain home until they are symptom-free for 24 hours without medication.

Vaccinating, masking, handwashing, staying home when ill, and maintaining physical distance are still the best strategies to reduce infection and spread. Adequate self-care is so important, even when we're feeling our best! If you need assistance scheduling vaccines or tests, or if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out. As previously outlined, **there will be no COVID safety check/pooled testing on Tuesday, December 21, 2021.** Due to the shortened week there is not adequate time to complete the follow-up required for any positive cases/contact tracing via the school. We will resume pooled testing on Tuesday, January 4, 2022. Best practice is to schedule a test for your students in advance to time their results with the return to school.
